

# MOVING AROUND THE CITY

With 2 tram routes, 21 bus routes, a funicular, and 180 km of cycle paths, the area benefits from an efficient transport network designed to make travel between the city centre and other places of interest (beach, shops, museums...) easy.

## Public transport

Two types of travel tickets :

- > Single tickets can be purchased at every tram stop or by mobile phone : just text "lh" 93 to 333 (1.80 €) to buy a single ticket
- > The LiA Pass : This personal travel pass grants unlimited access to buses, trams, the funicular, and LER trains all year long. To get one, visit one of the LiA outlets located within walking distance from the City Hall and at the local bus station.


## By bus

Buses operate 7 days a week, all year long (except on 1st May).

Routes 1, 2, 3, 4, and 22 operate until 12.30 am, in addition to the trams.

## By tram

Trams operate 7 days a week, all year long (except on 1st May) :

- > From Monday to Saturday : from 5 am to 12.30 am
- > On Sundays and bank holidays : from 6 am to 12.30 am

Tickets cannot be bought on board the tram. Self-service ticket machines are available at every tram stops.



## Use your mobile phone to buy tickets !

You can buy your single ticket by mobile phone. Just text "lh" to 93 333 (1.80 €) to buy one.

## By funicular

The funicular connects uptown to downtown. It operates 7 days a week, all year long (except on 1st May) :

- > From Monday to Saturday, from 7.30 am to 9 pm
- > On Sundays and bank holidays, from 7.30 am to 7.30 pm

## Good to know



All LiA tickets grant access to the funicular. Specific funicular tickets are also available.

## Lime Scooters

- > 1080 scooters are deployed in public spaces in Le Havre and we are among the cities using scooters the most, ahead of Dubai and New York.
- > The scooters are self-service 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. They are accessible everywhere, an extension of the perimeter has been put in place and they can be reserved via the Lime application.
- > For a price of: €1 for unlocking and then 20 cents per minute.



## Important

Scooters are prohibited from sidewalks, unless they are hand-held. Their speed must also be limited to 25 km/h. Wearing a helmet is not obligatory but strongly recommended.

## By bicycle

A 180 km cycle path network – with an additional 55 km completed in 2020 by Le Havre Seine Métropole – allows you to ride safely through the city. New temporary cycle paths have also been designed recently.

## Services to help you ride smoothly

Bicycle parks are accessible 24 hours a day to LiA Pass holders. 2,700 bicycle stands are spread across the city.

Free bicycle parking



[is available](#) in the City Hall, Coty, and Railway Station car parks.

Free tyre inflation stations are also available near the beach and near the City Hall bus station.



### Bicycle maintenance

Bicycle maintenance and repair workshops take place on the first Wednesday of each month at the University of Le Havre Normandie.

**[La Roue Libre](#)** will be there to provide you with easy and low-cost solutions to help you repair your bike.

The association also organises casual and fun events dedicated to bicycle riders, like the famous “café cyclo-culturel”.

## Bicycle rental service

The “LiA Vélos” service offers both short and long-term rentals of standard, electric, and folding bicycles to meet the needs of tourists as well as those of the locals. To rent a bike :

### Railway station bicycle rental station

- > From 4th September 2020 to 13th April 2021 : open from Tuesday to Saturday, from 1 pm to 7 pm (except on bank holidays)
- > From 15th April to 14th September 2021 : open from Monday to Saturday, from 10 am to 7 pm

### Travelling bicycle rental station

- > On the beach, from 15th June to 15th September : open everyday from 10 am to 8 pm (short-term standard bicycle rentals only)



### Good news !

Standard bicycle rentals are free for students !

## By car

The student car park subscription allows you to park your car on all green zone spaces close to higher education institutions and in the Les Halles, P4 Vauban, and Jean-Jacques Rousseau car parks.
